

May 2020 Sightings Report

Notes:

1. May 2020 was a schizoid month, split almost perfectly in half. The average temperature split between halves of 18.3°F - 45.5° to 63.8° - was the 2nd greatest on record. With 0.2" of snow on the 9th, the first half saw the first May snow since 2010 at the 9th latest date and tied for the most May days with measurable snow at five. Record lows were set on May 5, 9, 12, and 13, with record low highs on May 9 and 11. The first 80° day on the 24th was the 12th latest for that. Then came the pattern switch toward a period in the 80s and 90s, with 93° on the 26th the 3rd warmest May day on record. For the month, temperatures averaged 55.0°F, 2.0° below normal. Precipitation totaled 1.92", 0.95" below normal. The only heavy rain event was on the 29th, with 0.77", but there were 13 days with some precipitation, one above normal. Snowfall totaled 0.2", 0.2' below normal.

Unsurprisingly, the cold start to May after a cool April pushed some of the early month arrivals back a bit, especially flycatchers. There was also a persistent omega block set up in the middle of the country that certainly influenced when Gulf migrants would push through and resulted in some interesting bursts of arrivals.

2. Again, essentially all the expected lingering waterfowl were recorded this month. Only Tundra Swan and Canvasback, often present through much of this month, and Eurasian Wigeon, which has often recently persisted into May, were missed. Continuing the trend of recent years, numbers of individuals for most species were low. Grebe numbers were also poor.

3. Moving into the new list order, again no Eurasian Collared-Dove. Cuckoos arrived as expected and by month's end were reported in good numbers. Common Nighthawk was a bit late, with no sizable numbers reported. The usual few E. Whip-poor-wills were scattered through the month. There were comments around hummingbirds late and missing from some locations, and there was no banding effort this year as a check. Rail reports were up a bit, possibly due to searches for BBA data. Again, many Sandhill Cranes were reported, both passing the hawk watch and from elsewhere around the region.

4. There was decent shorebird habitat in the fields some of the time, but birds visiting only a few sites or passing along the Lake Ontario shore. Lake Ontario was back to high levels, inundating many beaches and piers. The barrier beach island off the Braddock Bay East Spit was the site of many of the best records. Once again, 24 species were reported, including another rare-in-spring Piping Plover. On the scarce but nearly annual list were Whimbrel, Sanderling, Long-billed Dowitcher, Willet, and Red-necked Phalarope. Upland Sandpiper was not reported until May 20. There were few good counts for any species.

5. The usual gulls and terns were reported in typical to low numbers, with no big gatherings reported. The usual “winter” gulls were scarce, with a few isolated reports at late May dates and even beyond. There were no reports of rarer larids. Single Black Terns were seen along the Genesee River near the University of Rochester and at Braddock Bay near mid-month, with birds back in the Van Dyne Spoor marshes in the NMWMA all month but with a peak count of only six.

6. Loon numbers were low other than a peak of 95 Common Loons on May 1. Among the other waterbirds, rarities included reports of American White Pelican early and late in the month, a Snowy Egret on the 20th, and ibis reports including flyovers of 11 only identified as *plegladis* ibis species on the 11th at Braddock Bay and Sodus Point and a Glossy Ibis on the 29th in the NMWMA.

7. The only Black Vultures were singles at the hawk watch on May 2 and 26, with the former also sighted passing east along the lakeshore off Edgemere Drive. The hawk watch total for the month was decent at 23,121, with 4808 Turkey Vultures, 816 Bald Eagles, and 16,146 Broad-winged Hawks. But generally the count was down due to the weather and possibly some to reduced observer numbers on the busiest days. There were no real rarities spotted and no Northern Goshawk reports. There were seven days with total counts exceeding 1000, with the three highest of these on the first three days of the month. There are a few more details in the Noteworthy Records table and full details in the Hawkcount webpage.

8. Recall again that the non-passerine land birds have mostly been moved to earlier in the list. Owls and woodpeckers are now the bulk of this section. There were no Snowy Owl or Short-eared Owl reports for the month. After the Owl Woods counts dropped way off in the last half of April, a surprise was five Long-eared Owls on May 3-4, with an Eastern Screech Owl also perched in the “classroom” area on the 3rd. A single N. Saw-whet Owl on the 24th and a Long-eared Owl on the 25th were late-month surprises there. Counts for the season were low. Jim Adams will produce a summary report in the near future. After few reports early in the year, Red-headed Woodpecker was back to about 50 individuals reported at about 30 locations; again better numbers and more locations than in most recent years. Our regular three falcon species were reported in good numbers both passing the hawk watch and elsewhere in the region. American Kestrel numbers were especially high.

9. This May, all of the regularly expected passerine species were reported. With the cold start to the month, the usual bias in arrival dates toward the 1st quartile relative to the 1985 Monroe County Checklist distributions was bumped back to more than half in their interquartile ranges or later. Again, blocking weather patterns to our south and west resulted in some exciting bursts of arrivals and high counts. With all the Atlas work, there were many very large numbers of reports for some commoner species. It takes LOTS of work with the data to pull out details. Again, a few examples are noted in the Noteworthy Records table as numbers of eBird lines for the species for the month. You will find quite a few pretty good counts scattered through the passerine part of the list in the Noteworthy table. Still, generally numbers again seemed low. Several of the flycatchers, Red-eyed Vireo, and a number of the warblers were scarce until late in the season. There were mixed signals; e.g. there was a period with very good numbers for Swainson’s Thrush, but very few Gray-cheeked Thrushes were reported and none banded. A lone Pine Siskin report covered the “winter” finches. Rarer reports included: Western Kingbird; White-eyed Vireo; Sedge Wren; Clay-colored Sparrow; Yellow-breasted Chat; Prothonotary, Connecticut, Kentucky, and Prairie warblers; and Dickcissel.

Again, it is interesting to look at data as supplied by the BBBO banding station. This year's total was a bit over 20 % down from last year's and the lowest in the recent nine years. This year net hours were down about 3% from last year and also the corona virus restrictions resulted in much less help at the banding station. Comparing species numbers with their prior eight years' averages and using two Standard Deviations (STD) as the cutoff, this year there were two passerine species significantly higher – Bay-breasted Warbler and Blackburnian Warbler - and five lower – Northern Waterthrush, Common Yellowthroat, American Redstart, Wilson's Warbler, and Dark-eyed Junco. Again, most species' numbers banded fell well within one STD of their average. Once more we see Black-capped Chickadee sticking with alternate high and low years, this year low (3 vs. last year's 232 for the season). Winter Wren dropped off its alternating high/low years opposite to the chickadees with only 3 banded this year, the lowest for the nine years but still less than a two STD drop from the average due high annual variations. Always interesting!

10. Again, lots of data to summarize this season. About 146,266 lines of eBird data, BBBO banding records, the hawkcount table, geneseebirds posts, plus personal input from some observers. The nearly 50% jump in eBird records is likely substantially due to observers working on NY BBA III. Again, those interested in more details can go to the table of Noteworthy Records on the RBA website or dig deeper into the banding tally for the spring season on the BBBO website or the hawkwatch data at the Hawkcount site. There were about 610 unique observers contributing to eBird this month.
