#### **Notes:**

- 1. A generally cool and very weather-active month. The first eight days gave us a warm start, then a pressure trough set up sending the Great Lakes and Northeast a series of cool, wet events through the rest of the month. The warmest day was only 68°F on the 29<sup>th</sup>. Temperatures averaged 42.4°F, 3.9° below normal. Precipitation totaled 3.24", 0.51" above normal. There was some rainfall on 19 of the 30 days. Snowfall at 3.9" was right on normal. Just over an inch fell on each 7, 10, and 19 April. The Lake Ontario water level remained well above normal all month. Early, plant life was a couple of weeks ahead of typical, but by month's end we were about a week behind.
- 2. General comments on records this spring are complicated by the effects of the corona virus restrictions on gatherings and movements and of those related to efforts in data gathering for NY BBA III; competing or additive? Some people not working spent time outdoors walking and birding. But lack of open restaurants and restrooms may have limited the distances traveled and lengths of time out. Atlas work was really of limited value this early, but those trying may have limited their travels more to atlas Blocks. But the data gathering protocols also push more eBird lists over shorter times and distances. The eBird download for the month for this region was about 72,406 lines, compared with 56, 542 in April 2019. Migration seemed slow, yet the species count is typical.
- 3. Among the waterfowl, we have the usual essentially all expected species recorded. However, even early in the month there was the feel that the bulk of the migration had moved on, supported by relatively low peak counts, as illustrated in the maxima in the Noteworthy Records table. Nothing stood out as an especially good count. This continued for the grebes. There were some good Red-necked Grebe counts from Hamlin Beach early in the month. These are hard to put in context, as many of the really big counts from the past involved totals of tallies at several lakeshore sites from the west side of Braddock Bay to well west of Hamlin Beach. An Eared Grebe, seen by a few birders off Hamlin Beach on the 8<sup>th</sup>, was the only real rarity in this grouping.
- 4. Sandhill Crane numbers, passing the hawk watch and elsewhere at other expected locations, were good. The high water levels limited shorebird habitat on lakeshore sites. Wet fields were scattered about, but arriving shorebirds unpredictable in location and in low numbers. Willet and Wilson's Phalarope were the most interesting, but both one-day wonders.
- 5. The gulls and terns were again at routine numbers and arrival dates. Two Little Gulls were again the only scarcer species reported and again at Sodus Point and Hamlin Beach SP. Numbers of winter species lingering were still good. Among the terns, Black Tern was not sighted in our region this month.

- 6. On to loons vultures, we find peak numbers of both of our regular loon species low. Double-crested Cormorant numbers were good late in the month. With an American White Pelican here in March and more all around us most of this month, one on Silver Lake on the 18<sup>th</sup> was not a huge surprise. Least Bittern arrival was again early on the 18th, just a day later than last year's record early. Black Vulture was seen both passing the hawk watch and over Shaker Heights near Sodus Bay.
- 7. At the hawk watch, counts were all in the neighborhood of half of last year's numbers including the total but excepting Broad-winged Hawk at less than 1/3 and then American Kestrel almost double this year and highest in many years, Merlin up 50%, and Peregrine Falcon up a bit. Turkey Vultures doubled Broad-winged Hawks for the month. Only four days produced 1000-bird counts. Details are presented in the Hawkcount site online. The DEC owl surveys on the 14<sup>h</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> located one and two Short-eared Owls, respectively. Jim Adams again summarized the owl counting at the "Owl Woods" area on Manitou Beach Road. No new N. Saw-whet Owls were added, leaving the season's total at 23, 20+% below the recent yearly average. Eight more Long-eared Owls brought that species' total to nine, only about 25% of average. Clearly, limited observers had some influence on numbers this year. The Northern Flicker movement was again tallied passing the East Spit in good numbers late in the month.
- 8. The BBBO banding numbers were also low, less than half of last year for the last half month and still low adding in five days early in the month, though total net hours were comparable. There was an issue with social distancing limiting the help at the banding station. Golden-crowned Kinglet was up quite a bit due to the early month banding but Ruby-crowned Kinglet down. The Blackcapped Chickadee seesaw, is right as expected – a down year and only one banded. Again, many of the late April passerines either just made it in the last few days of the month or slipped into May. Also again, only four species of warblers were banded. However, we were up to 18 warbler species reported by month's end vs. only 12 species last year. Eight passerine species arrived at dates early by the old (1984) summary, but only Blue-headed Vireo was actually record early, the others having been reported earlier yet in the intervening years. Species that often pass in large numbers, such as Blue Jay, American Crow, and American Robin, were not tallied in sizable numbers this month. There were some good Tree and Barn Swallow counts, but no other outstanding passerine counts. Passerine rarities included a first regional spring report for Cave Swallow at the hawkwatch on the 12<sup>th</sup> by David Brown and Greg Lawrence, the region's 4<sup>th</sup> **Bullock's Oriole** seen at two feeders in the Lyons area from the 7<sup>th</sup>-9th, and Yellow-throated Warblers photographed at both Ellison Park and Sandy Bottom Park. There also were two European Goldfinches at a feeder on the 21<sup>st</sup>, likely escaped birds.
