## **June 2021 Records Report**

## **Notes:**

- 1. A warm, sunny month to start the summer season. Temperatures averaged 70.8°F, 3.7° above normal, tying for the 3<sup>rd</sup> warmest June in 151 years of records. Records were set for a new high on the 29<sup>th</sup> and a new high low for the 27<sup>th</sup> and tied for the high low on the 28<sup>th</sup> and all time high low for June on the 27<sup>th</sup>. Eighteen days exceeded 80° and four days 90°. There was a brief cooler break from 14-18 June. Precipitation totaled 1.73″, 1.64″ below normal, with 0.47″ of that falling on the 19<sup>th</sup>. There were occasional showers and thunderstorms, but the heaviest rain and some wind damage occurred south of the Rochester area.
- 2. Weather conditions were generally good for birding, and NY BBA III held a field work contest late in the month, both spurring the input of many eBird lists. The eBird records download, 69,367, culled to about 51,421 after removing out-of-region records, was about 5 % above that from last June. 202 species reported for the month lies between the 10-year average and last year's record high. All of the really expected species were reported. The few "misses" were species whose spring departure distributions have tails into early June, many often banded in the first week of the month. Off-list rarities included: Marbled Godwit, Laughing Gull, Franklin's Gull, White-faced Ibis, and Sedge Wren. A rare-for-the-season Iceland Gull appeared near month's end.
- 3. Waterfowl were generally scarce and numbers low; only Mute Swan was tallied at really high numbers. Most of the noteworthy reports are either just departure dates or late records of species that have previously lingered occasionally late or even all summer. Many of the reports were from the Braddock Bay barrier beach island, and fewer than usual were from the NMWMA.
- 4. Good numbers of cuckoos continued to be recorded in gypsy moth outbreak areas. Common Nighthawk continued into the month in small numbers but with also a single report late in the month. Common Gallinule and American Coot numbers remained way down in the NMWMA (Van Dyne Spoor Rd.) area. Sandhill Cranes were again reported at known and suspected breeding sites.

- 5. Late spring shorebird variety was good at 19 species. Much of the reporting was from the Braddock Bay barrier beach site. There were the usual late spring migrant species and then some of the same noted as likely early fall migrants late in the month. Marbled Godwit was reported there as a likely continuing rarity, and finally an Upland Sandpiper was recorded in the Geneseo area as a first for this year. June 3 was an especially good date for shorebirds, and a good high count of 918 Semipalmated Sandpipers was noted on that date. Otherwise, peak counts were low. Among the larids, Laughing Gull and Franklin's Gull were noted and photographed together at the barrier beach on 2 and 7 June, Lesser Black-backed Gull was present nearly all month and 10-12 were counted early in the month, and an Iceland Gull appeared there late in the month. One Red-throated Loon and a few Common Loons lingered into the month. A White-faced Ibis was reported at the barrier beach site on the 29th by Jim Miles and Phil Mills. Black Vulture was not reported.
- 6. Among the raptors, the expected species were reported but there was no concerted effort at maintaining a hawk watch into the month, or at least no large numbers reported. Again, no reports for Northern Goshawk. Red-headed Woodpecker at only about 8 sites was not particularly encouraging for a month with focused BBA efforts. There were again two reports of nesting pairs of Merlin, ten total reports. There were only about seven Peregrine Falcon reports from six locations other than the downtown breeding pair in Rochester. The rfalconcam website reported that four eggs were laid and two young hatched in May. Both, a male and a female, were banded on 2 June and fledged on 19 and 20 June, respectively. The female was found dead on a nearby rooftop on 30 June.
- 7. This year, while all of the truly expected passerine species were reported, several of the late migrants typically banded or observed into June were missed, including; Olive-sided Flycatcher, Philadelphia Vireo, and Lincoln's Sparrow. There were only one Gray-cheeked and eight Swainson's Thrushes banded, and numbers banded for the migrant warblers were low. Rarer passerines for this month were: Sedge Wren and Yellow-breasted Chat plus the scarce but more regular now Clay-colored Sparrow, Prothonotary Warbler, and Prairie Warbler, all at known sites. There were no really exceptional counts noted.
