

## May 2021 Records Report

### Notes:

1. May 2021 continued the cool of late April and moved back to dry. Temperatures averaged 56.9°F, 1.9° below normal. It was the third consecutive May with a below normal average. Precipitation totaled 1.28", 1.58" below normal; 17<sup>th</sup> driest May on record. The only significant rain events were 0.24" on the 7<sup>th</sup> and 0.57" on the 28<sup>th</sup>. There was an official trace of snow and some on the hilltops south of Rochester through the 9<sup>th</sup>. The first half of the month and the last five days were cool spells, with some summer warmth between. One record high was tied at 88° on the 26<sup>th</sup>.

2. Again, essentially all the expected waterfowl were recorded this month. The trend of recent years continued, with departure dates generally on the early side and numbers of individuals for most species low. Decent peak counts were reported for only Mute Swan, Long-tailed Duck, Bufflehead, and Red-breasted Merganser. Canvasback and Surf Scoter, often present through much of this month, were missed. An interesting and increasing new development was the increase in waterfowl and other waterbirds appearing and increasing on and around the barrier beach island at the mouth of Braddock Bay. In the table, records will appear as Braddock Bay-East Spit. Grebe numbers were also poor and departure dates early.

3. Moving along the new list order, a nice surprise was a White-winged Dove (5<sup>th</sup> regional record) seen and photographed by David Brown as it passed the hawkwatch. Cuckoos arrived as expected and were reported in good numbers in areas with gypsy moth outbreaks. Common Nighthawk was again a bit late with no sizable numbers reported. E. Whip-poor-will again persisted to mid-month. There were comments around hummingbirds late and missing from some locations; the number banded was down a bit from the past 9-year average. Sandhill Crane numbers, both passing the hawk watch and from elsewhere around the region, remained good.

4. Shorebird habitat was good in the farm fields, at near lakeshore sites, and in the NMWMA area on Carncross Road. The primary hotspot through the season was the barrier beach island at Braddock Bay, with most of the rarer species seen there, including: Piping Plover (9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup>

regional records), Marbled Godwit, Stilt Sandpiper (rare in spring), and several of the many Wilson's Phalarope reports (seen scattered over the region and month). There were 24 species reported and some good counts summarized in the Noteworthy Records Table. Upland Sandpiper was not reported through season's end.

5. The expected gulls and terns were all reported, mostly in typical to low numbers. The barrier beach island was again the focal point for peak gatherings and rarities. Two possibly more Laughing Gulls were reported, Iceland Gull was present past month's end, and Glaucous Gull through mid-month. The region's 2<sup>nd</sup> spring Least Tern was also seen by many on the 23<sup>rd</sup>. Lesser Black-backed Gull was reported there through the month, with as many as 15 in a single count (also 10 in the Ontario Beach area). Black Terns were relatively scarce but also reported at the barrier beach island.

6. Loon reports and numbers were low other than 110 Common Loons on 8 May. However, the other waterbirds and waders provided some excitement, with: a very rare adult Northern Gannet on the 13<sup>th</sup> (passing the hawkwatch and later off Sodus Point), nine American White Pelicans on the 26<sup>th</sup>, Snowy Egret on the 13<sup>th</sup>, Cattle Egret on the 2<sup>nd</sup>, as many as 22 Glossy Ibis passing Beechwood State Park and nearby on the 19<sup>th</sup>, and White-faced Ibis at Carncross Road on the 18<sup>th</sup> and the barrier beach and nearby on the 22-23 May.

7. Black Vultures were seen in the NMWMA and at the hawk watch on 2 and 22 May, respectively. Generally, hawk watch numbers, peaks and totals, were low, with the overall total for the month 12, 804, half of those Broad-winged Hawks. Interesting total counts were 4,797 Turkey Vultures, 506 Bald Eagles, and only 6,423 Broad-winged Hawks. There were no Northern Goshawk reports. But there were two rarities, with Mississippi Kite on 25 and 26 May and an immature light morph Swainson's Hawk on 26 May, banded at BBRR and then passing the hawk watch and points east. As usual, there are a few more details in the Noteworthy Records table and full details at the Hawkcount webpage.

8. Recall again that the non-passerine land birds have mostly been moved to earlier in the list. Owls and woodpeckers are now the bulk of this section. The Owl Woods counts continued, with five Long-eared Owls added through the 13<sup>th</sup>. Short-eared Owls persisted in the general Braddock Bay area into this month. Red-headed Woodpecker numbers were again decent at about 35 total at 25 locations. Our regular three falcon species were reported in reasonably good numbers.

9. This May all of the regularly expected passerine species were reported, with only a few irregular rarities were missed. With another cold start to the month, the usual bias in arrival dates toward the 1<sup>st</sup> quartile relative to the 1985 Monroe County Checklist distributions was again bumped back to more than half in their interquartile ranges or later. Some of the flycatchers and warblers were noted as especially late or scarce. Again, all the Atlas work resulted in very large numbers of reports for some commoner species. It takes LOTS of work with the data to pull out details. Also again, a few examples are noted in the Noteworthy Records table as numbers of eBird lines for the species for the month, and you will find quite a few examples of good counts scattered through the passerine part of the list in the Noteworthy table. The banders noted that most of their captures concentrated in a narrow window from 14-22 May, with most other days quiet. Among the "winter" finches, Evening Grosbeak and both crossbills were reported to mid-month or beyond. Rarer reports

included: White-eyed Vireo, Clay-colored Sparrow, Yellow-breasted Chat, Prothonotary Warbler, and Prairie Warbler.

Next, we can look at data supplied by the BBBO banding station. This year's total was up a bit over 20 % from last year's and very near the average for the recent nine years, but the net hours for this year were also up about 20% from last year. Comparing numbers banded by species with the prior nine years' averages and using two Standard Deviations (STD) as the cutoff, this year there were two passerine species significantly higher – Cape May Warbler and Northern Parula - and three lower – Yellow-bellied Flycatcher, “Traill's” Flycatcher, and Wilson's Warbler. But this reminds one of the care needed in using such comparison's, as both those flycatchers often see half of their numbers banded in June, final numbers not yet available. Again, most species' numbers banded fell well within one STD of their average. Black-capped Chickadee stayed with its alternate high and low years, this year high (last three – 232, 3, and now 675). Last year's Winter Wren aberration looks likely to be a COVID-driven anomaly, with this year back on its alternating high/low years opposite to the chickadees. Interesting? Or wasting my time?

10. Lots of data to summarize this season. About 139,389 lines of eBird data, BBBO banding records, the hawkcount table, geneseebirds posts, plus personal input from some observers. The eBird record total is very close to last year's. Again, those interested in more details can go to the table of Noteworthy Records on the RBA website or dig deeper into the banding tally for the spring season on the BBBO website or the hawkwatch data at the Hawkcount site. There were about 716 unique observers contributing to eBird this month.
